Timeline

- **Nov 3:** Announce auditions and share materials
- **Dec 1:** Virtual recordings due
- **Dec 2–12:** In-person sight reading auditions
- **Dec 15–18:** Evaluate and finalize placements

Part 1: Virtual Recording Submission (Due Dec. 1)

Students will submit audio/video recordings via Google Forms:

- **Major Scales - Concert Bb (2 octave) and Concert G (2 octave)**
- **Region Band Etude Excerpt**
- **Practice & Commitment Survey**

Part 2: In-Person Audition (Dec. 2–12)

- 8-measure sight reading excerpt
- 30-second session; evaluate tone, note/rhythm accuracy, and musicality
